Ensuring a clean, safe, and compliant workplace is a critical component of opening for business after a pandemic. But where do you start?

Step 1: Ensure clean practices by staff



Create and communicate new protocols



Follow guidelines from the CDC, OSHA, EU-OSHA and other health agencies, as well as industry-specific requirements



Be audit-ready:

- Track compliance with automated maintenance checklists and workflows
- Monitor staff skill sets, training, and qualifications and digitize manager signoffs

Step 2: Update preventive maintenance schedules ·



Increase frequency of cleaning and maintenance of critical/high-touch equipment



Specify and provide required personal protective equipment (PPE), disinfectant, and other safety materials



Document your health and safety practices

Step 3: Identify assets at risk



Determine which assets have the greatest impact on safe and efficient operations



Perform a risk assessment and assign a reliability score



Prioritize the maintenance of critical assets to mitigate contamination or health hazards

Step 4: Prepare for changing expectations



Manage frequent updates to environmental, health, and safety regulations



Enable 100% compliance as the requirement, not the goal



Ensure the availability of real-time data about adherence, training, certifications, and hazardous material handling

Step 5: Move from preventive to prescriptive maintenance





Integrate across facilities and the supply chain to ensure organization-wide compliance



Incorporate historical elements: failure analysis, repair codes, warranty definitions, and original equipment manufacturer (OEM) expectations
